

## **EDITORIAL**

Following Prime Minister Narendra Modi's announcement, the government indicated that it is seriously considering the implementation of the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) and is going to draft it soon. Therefore, the Law Commission of India has also asked people's opinion regarding UCC. All these news have re-started the debate on Uniform Civil Code in the country. Representing the Muslim position, the All India Muslim Personal Law Board clearly stated that the change in the Muslim Personal Laws is an act of abrogation of the Islamic Shariat because these laws are derived from the Qur'an and Sunnah. Although it is very difficult to prevent personal laws from being followed, it depends on how the law will be made. After this narrative came out, the argument from the opposition camp was also released in the media that Muslims have abandoned all Sharia laws and want to follow only the part of Sharia that is against women. A debate was also started as to why when changes were made in Hindu Personal Laws, Muslim Personal Laws could not be changed. Some of the intellectuals of the government presented a very modern theory of the history of the evolution of Muslim Personal Laws while publicizing their enthusiasm. However, this narrative, adorned with intellectual tricks, is not something new, but it is a copy of the narrative of Westernized Orientalists. According to this narrative, the implementation of UCC is not a negation of the Islamic mood, because Muslim personal law has always undergone a process of change in history, so even today it can be changed anew. Come on! Consider these questions.

Personal laws or family laws are those which deal with personal and family matters of every person. It is a short part of civil laws. Personal laws has to be done by an individual or family members themselves. There is no role of the government in its implementation. While the law enforcement of military rule etc. is done by the government, it cannot be implemented by the people individually. Therefore,

those ignorant people who are talking that Muslims are demanding only a part of the Sharia law, they should understand that only the Islamic government can implement the Criminal Laws. To demand this from a non-Islamic government is to make a mockery of Islamic Sharia. Therefore, since the end of Muslim rule in India, all Islamic laws were repealed, but Muslim personal laws continued to be practiced. Because the Muslims knew that a Muslim government was necessary for the implementation of all laws except personal laws.

Muslims have always protested against the abrogation of personal law because they believe that it is not legally permissible to withdraw from any part of the Sharia that we can follow. And whenever there is an opportunity to follow the complete Islamic Shari'ah, a practicing Muslim will never avoid it. The faith of the Muslims is that whenever there is a limitation in any part of the earth, Allah Ta'ala opens the treasures of blessings in it. So, when the children of Israel abandoned the implementation of the Shariat, Allah Ta'ala commanded them to return to it, saying, "I wish they had established the Torah and the Bible and the other books that were sent down to them from their Lord. If they had done so, sustenance would have rained down for them from above and boiled from below" (Al-Ma'idah). That is, for a group that has divine commandments, the implementation of Allah's limits is a guarantee of the work of this world and the hereafter. It is evident that the reason for the prosperity and development of the Islamic society in the early centuries was that there was complete rule of the Qur'an. And those people were not ready to deviate even an inch from it. But as soon as the Muslims compromised with this attitude, the Ummah continued to decline.

Therefore, if the Muslims abandon personal laws today, it will lead to their further decline. Today, any part of the Islamic Sharia is enforced in the Muslim countries, it has become a source of blessings. Afghanistan is a great example of this. The current Afghan government has implemented full Sharia law there. And their trend suggests that they are slowly making progress towards a modern Islamic state. Although this government has only been in office for a short time, but in such a short period of time, Afghanistan has



started to turn around. During the NATO government, Afghanistan was completely dependent on foreign aid. As soon as NATO left, it seemed that Afghanistan's economy would collapse. But the current statistics show that Afghanistan's imports and exports have increased. The Taliban has also started oil extraction projects through Another welcome Chinese companies. news came recently is that Afghanistan has one of the largest reserves of lithium, which will lead to further economic prosperity. Those countries of the world who understand that these people are strong in character are actively participating in development projects in Afghanistan. All these news shows that the days of economic misery in Afghanistan are numbered. How did all these things come about? The main reason for this is that the government has implemented complete Sharia law. Due to the return of Zakat and Ushar system and the almost elimination of malfeasance, the government has overcome the economic crisis to a great extent. Therefore, it seems that the promise made by Allah Ta'ala in the above mentioned verses is proving to be true in Afghanistan. (Surat No. 62 - Verse 01 and 02)

In these verses, it has been explained that what was the purpose of Prophet Muhammad's mission and what was the fundamental methodology to achieve this noble cause. The Prophet Muhammed (PBUH) is appointed to meet the demands of attributes of Allah (SWT), enlisted in the verse mentioned above and the blessed verse explains the three underlying "principle elements" of Prophet's (PBUH) call, to serve a purpose of his (PBUH) appointment as a prophet.

- 1) Recitation of book (Quran)
- 2) Purification of soul (Tazkiya)
  - 3) Teaching the wisdom (Taleem e Hikmat )

In this verse the underlying principle and complete methodology to provide cadre for the desired revolution (Islam) is explained. When Prophet (PBUH) started his Dawah, dignified people quickly or afterwards attracted towards Quran and accepted it. ### A DIVINE BLESSING FOR SOCIETY

ISLAM! ISLAM HAS AN ENTIRELY DIFFERENT SYSTEM THAT MEETS ALL HUMAN NEEDS; FULFILS ALL THE NATURAL RIGHTS OF ALL PEOPLE



arriage is a sacred institution and **L**a blessing from Allah that fosters companionship, responsibility, and procreation within a lawful and harmonious relationship. Allah states in the Quran, "And of His signs is that He created for you from yourselves mates that you may find tranquility in them; and He placed between you affection and mercy. Indeed, in that are signs for a people who give thought" (Quran 30:21). This verse highlights the divine wisdom behind marriage, emphasizing the bond of love, compassion, and harmony that it brings to individuals and society as a whole.

However, in the modern world, we are often bombarded with messages promoting the idea of complete independence. We are told to be self-sufficient, self-reliant, and to strive for individual success without needing anyone else. We now live in a hyper-independent society that is highly individualistic, teaching us that only our own feelings matter. So, why even maintain a "relationship" when you could satisfy your primal urges through short-term sexual "adventures" such as promiscuity, adultery, or live-in relationships? If it's all just about you and you alone, why even "bother" committing to a long-term relationship? This condition of society is due to the prevailing system.

The system that exists in today's secular countries is a liberal system. It promotes liberalism, which maximizes personal liberty, freedom, and equality. In other words, it worships the self, being completely consumed with the individual at the expense of all else. Everything in a secular, liberal society revolves around the individual and the individual alone. The entire system is built on a foundation of selfishness, atomization, and isolation, leading to men separating from women and parents being separated from their children. The natural ties between people are severed, organic bonds are broken, and normal relationships that are supposed to exist between human beings are destroyed.

An example prevalent in today's society is that of the "single mother." According to the U.S. Census Bureau, out of about 10 million single-parent families with children under the age of 18, almost 80 percent are headed by single mothers. Today, 1 in 5 children under the age of 18 — a total of about 15.7 million — are being raised without a father (around half of single mothers have never married). There are many other examples, such as an increase in rape, drug addiction, and the list goes on. What is the result of all these "rights," hyperfocused on only the individual and their own momentary pleasures? The rights of others are trampled underfoot. Children suffer and are abandoned, marriages suffer and die, families suffer and break down, society weakens, and civilizations collapse.

But what's the alternatives? ISLAM! Islam has an entirely different system that meets all human needs; fulfils all the natural rights of all people; and

organizes society in a way that beautifully aligns with our inherent human nature and does not destroy it. Islam deepens our intuitive love for our loved ones and nurtures our organic human relationships. But how? By creating an institution i.e. 'Marriage'. Abdullah ibn Umar narrates صلى الله عليه that the Prophet Muhammad بسر, said: "Each of you is a shepherd and is responsible for his flock. A ruler who rules over people is a shepherd and is responsible for them. The man is a shepherd over his family and is responsible for them. The woman is a shepherd over her husband's home and children and is responsible for them". Islam clearly defines the role and responsibility such as gender roles (where the husband has financial obligations and the wife is free to be a mother at home with her children); birr al-walidayn (excellence towards parents), which ensures respect for parents from their children; silat alrahim (maintaining the ties of kinship), which assures the safety net and support network of extended family and relatives and also maintains ancestry.

Turning away from Allah's Law leads to causing corruption on the earth as well as destroying family ties. It is crucial to recognize and appreciate the divine wisdom behind this divine institution (Marriage) and strive to build strong, harmonious marriages in order to experience the blessings that come with it in individual and collective life.

that required urgent addressing.

The Muslims in Madinah consisted virtually of two parties: The first one already settled down in their abode, land and wealth, fully at ease, but seeds of discord amongst them were deeply seated and chronic enmity continually evoked; they were Al-Ansar (the Helpers). The second party were Al-Muhajirun (the Emigrants), homeless, jobless and penniless. Their number was not small, on the contrary, it was increasing them the green light to leave for Madinah whose economic structure, originally not that prosperous one, began to show signs of imbalance aggravated by the economic boycott that the anti-Islamic groups imposed and consequently imports diminished and living conditions worsened.

## MADINAH

The Madinese era could be divided into three phases:

- 1. The first phase was characterized by too much trouble and discord, and too many obstacles from within coupled by a hostile wave from without aiming at total extermination of the rising faith. It ended with Al-Hudaibiyah Peace Treaty in Dhul Qa'da 6 A.H.
- 2. The second phase featured a truce with the pagan leadership and ended in the conquest of Makkah in Ramadan 8 A.H. It also witnessed the Prophet inviting kings beyond Arabia to enter the fold of Islam.
- 3. In the third phase, people came to embrace Islam in hosts. Tribes and other folks arrived in Madinah to pay homage to the Prophet in. It ended at the death of the Prophet in Rabi' Al-Awwal 11 A.H.

The First Phase: The Status Quo in Madinah at the Time of Emigration

Emigration to Madinah could never be attributable to attempts to escape from jeers and oppression only, but it also constituted a sort of cooperation with the aim of erecting the pillars of a new society in a secure place. Hence it was incumbent upon every capable Muslim to contribute to building this new homeland, immunizing it and holding up its prop. As a leader and spiritual guide, there was
